CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

- 1. The regularly scheduled meeting of the Council of the City of Flemington was called to order by Mayor Paul Hawkins on Tuesday, March 14th, 2023 at 4:31 p.m. in the Council Room at Flemington City Hall. A quorum necessary to conduct business was visibly present.
- 2. Mayor Hawkins welcomed all attendees, both in person and virtually.
- 3. The invocation was given by Councilwoman Harwell and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilman Patel.
- 4. Councilwoman Smiley made a motion to accept the minutes from the February 14th, 2023 regular meeting minutes as written. Councilwoman Harwell seconded the motion. All approved. The motion passed. Note: The meeting minutes were corrected to show Councilwoman Smiley present at the February meeting.
- 5. SGT Anthony Gallob was in attendance and provided the law enforcement report for the month of February.
- 6. Council reviewed the Expense Report for the month of February and the Hotel-Motel Tax Report for January.
- 7. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Jeff Ricketson with the Liberty Consolidated Planning Commission ("LCPC") came before Council to report that the Unified Development Ordinance ("UDO") was ready to move forward and that they would like to proceed with a public hearing on May 9th. The Council agreed.

Mr. Ricketson also presented a sign permit for Florabelle Flowers & Gifts located at 69 Old Sunbury Rd. *Councilwoman Harwell made a motion to approve the sign permit. Councilwoman Evans seconded the motion. All approved. The motion passed.*

The last item presented was a discussion item for the front setbacks in planned unit developments ("PUD's"). There was some dialogue regarding parking challenges and increased setbacks may place the homes closer to wetlands. Ultimately, *Councilman Edwards made a motion to instruct the LCPC to tell developers that the Council prefers a 20-foot setback in PUD's. (No change to the ordinance, just guidance.) Councilwoman Harwell seconded the motion. All approved. The motion passed.*

8. BUSINESS IN PROGRESS – Status Update(s)

- a. The City Engineer, Mr. Marcus Sack presented the finalized road prioritization list. He stated that Old Sunbury Road had about 6000 vehicles per day, with a high speed of 86 miles per hour. He stated that Liberty County Commissioner Eddie Waldon had requested the list. Several members of Council requested a workshop with the City's fund balances to go over the findings of Mr. Sack's report.
- b. Mr. Larry Golden with Golden & Associates, CPA's came before Council again to report that his firm was in the process of completing the FY22 audit. He stated that the CARES Act funding had created extra work and that he should have the amounts for reporting the next few upcoming weeks. He stated that the fund balances would be ready at the same time and that he anticipated presenting Council a full report at the May meeting.
