FLEMINGTON'S POST OFFICE

1889-1966

Our post office operated from 1889 until 1966 when the USPS made ZIP codes mandatory. At that time, the USPS determined there were not enough Flemington rooftops to keep our PŎ in operation, and so they shut us down and had the Hinesville PO start delivering our mail.

And that is why our mailing address is Hinesville.



Tentative Millage Rate

This tentative increase will result in a millage rate of 3.514 mills, an increase of 3.514 mills. Without this tentative tax increase, the millage rate will be no more than 0 mills. The proposed tax increase for a fair market value of \$100,000.00 is approximately \$140.56 and the proposed tax increase for non-homestead property with a fair market value of \$150,000 is approximately \$210.84.

CITY OF HINESVILLE MILLAGE RATE: 10.1 MILLS

Why is there a need for a millage rate now?

The City's capacity to uphold sustainability for more than 80 years prior to introducing a property tax showcases the local government's dedication to responsibly managing both the City and its financial resources.

The Fiscal Year 2025 General Fund budget stands at million, with service-related expenses \$1.18 surpassing revenues by \$85,000, a shortfall that can be covered by the reserves in the General Fund.

When expenses surpass income, it's essential to implement a proactive financial plan for future fiscal years.



THE COST TO MAINTAIN THE CITY AND ITS SERVICES EXCEEDS THE REVENUE GENERATED.

THE BUDGET EXPENSES MUST BE PAID WITH GENERAL FUNDS.

FAQ'S

WHY DID THE NEWSPAPER REPORT A 100% TAX INCREASE?

The City has never established a millage rate before, so implementing even a 1 mill rate would be a 100% increase. The terminology is required by law.

WILL ALL MY TAXES INCREASE 100%?

The City of Flemington's millage rate will **not** be applied to your entire property tax bill. It will show as a separate line item.

IS THE CITY IN A LOT OF DEBT?

The City has always been debt-free and still operates on a cash basis; however, the cost to provide services increases significantly each year.

FAQ'S Continued.

IS THE CITY FACING FINANCIAL DISTRESS?

No, we have some general fund reserves. However, we all can understand that when you begin to utilize reserves to meet expenditures, it signals the need to implement a proactive plan for the next fiscal year.

IS THE CITY OVERPAYING FOR SERVICES?

All City contracts go through a bidding process. Each IGA, contract, and agreement is regularly reviewed to confirm that the services offered are delivered at a reasonable and justifiable rate.

WHAT ABOUT UTILIZING IMPACT FEE MONEY?

Impact fee funds have strict regulations that mandate their use. The City entered into an agreement with the Hinesville to purchase a fire truck utilizing \$800k in impact fee funds. In return, the City receives a \$171k credit per year (for 5 years) against fire protection fees. That FY25 expense is \$197k after applying the credit.

FAQ'S Continued.

WHAT IS THE CITY DOING WITH THE 9 ACRES ACROSS FROM CITY HALL?

The consistent feedback from residents highlights the necessity for a park where families can spend quality time together. While the creation of a park is part of our work in progress, it will require careful planning to ensure it connects the Downtown District and the Historic District seamlessly.

WHEN WILL NEIGHBORHOOD ROADS BE REPAVED?

The City utilizes TSPLOST as one of the ways to fund road projects and repairs; however, the TSPLOST renewal referendum recently failed to pass. TSPLOST is not a new sales tax - it's a continuation of what we were already had. When it returns to the ballot, please consider renewing it.

CAN YOU REDUCE YOUR STAFF?

The City of Flemington employs one full-time staff member, the City Clerk, along with one part-time Building Assistant.

The next step is to adopt the millage rate.





The City Council of Flemington has scheduled a special meeting for December 17th, 2024, at 4:30 PM. The agenda for this meeting is to adopt the Millage Rate for 2024. The meeting will be held at Flemington City Hall, situated at 156 Old Sunbury Road.


